Miriam is a prizewinner in numerous International and National competitions, including 1st Prizes from Grand Virtuoso International Competition with invitation to perform at Royal Albert Hall London, IMKA competition, North Online International Competition & Virtuoso Belcanto International Competition dedicated to Paganini. Following his acclaimed debut with Manhattan Symphony Orchestra under the baton of Jonathan Strasser, Michael has performed thousands of solo, chamber, and orchestral concerts, collaborating with conductors like Kynan Johns, Dmitri Yablonsky, and Robert Lehrbaumer.

Winner of many competitions, including Artists International, Michael has been featured on CBS and Channel 12 programs and WQXR and WWFM radio stations, in addition to international media: TV1 (Russia), TV3 (Estonia), RAI 1 (Italy), and Nippon TV (Japan).
